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To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas

Ann Turner

has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Fort Wayne, Indiana

whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Ann Turner*

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the north fraction of the North West quarter of Section Fifteen, in township thirty north of Range twelve East, in the District of Fort Wayne and State of Indiana, containing Ninety One Acres and twenty five hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Ann Turner*

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have Given and Granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said *Ann Turner* and to her heirs — the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said *Ann Turner* and her heirs and assigns forever.
